SECTION 1 - OPERATING AND OTHER FINANCIAL AUTHORITIES

- Column 1.20 Contracting Authority has been increased from \$5K to \$10K for Assistant Deputy Minister to Executive Assistant positions to support departmental direction on the increased use of acquisition cards;
- Column 1.20 Contracting Authority for Corporate positions no longer involved in the new centralized contracting and procurement process has been removed;
- Certification Authority (Sec. 34) New corporate authority has been delegated to the Functional specialist – ICAAD position for the certification of Interdepartmental Settlement (IS) transactions;
- Columns 1.25 to 1.27 The delegated authorities pertaining to Write-offs of Crown Assets and Debts and the Waivers (reduction of Interest) have been removed from the body of the Operating and Other Financial Authorities Matrix and consolidated into a separate Matrix (Section 5);
- Administrative updates have been made to reflect changes to the organizational structure and corporate position titles.

SECTION 2 - LEGISLATIVE PROGRAMS FINANCIAL AUTHORITIES

- Column 2.04 The delegated authorities pertaining to Remission of Canada Pension Plan (CPP) and Old Age Security (OAS) have been removed from the body of the Legislative Program Financial Authorities Matrix and consolidated into a separate Matrix (Section 5);
- Column 2.04 Authority has been added to current delegated Program positions for the certification (Sec.34) of the monthly transfer for the reimbursement of benefits to the Quebec

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Pension Plan (QPP). Corporate certification (Sec.34) authority has also been delegated to the CFO and Senior DG ICAAD positions for the monthly transfer to QPP;

- Column 2.10 Corporate certification (Sec.34) authority has been delegated to the CFO position for the Common Experience Payment component of the Indian Residential School project;
- Columns 2.11 to 2.13 New Program positions have been delegated certification (Sec.34) authority for the transactions against the Annuities Account, the Civil Servant Insurance Account and the Annuities Agents. Corporate certification (Sec.34) authority has also been delegated to the CFO and Senior DG ICAAD positions for the Annuities Account, the Civil Servant Insurance Account and the Annuities Agents;
- Column 2.14 Corporate certification (Sec.34) authority has been delegated to the CFO and Senior DG ICAAD positions for the Transactions against the Employment Insurance (EI) Operating Account. Corporate certification (Sec.34) and Payment (Sec.33) authorities have also been delegated to the Director and Functional Specialists ICAAD positions for the Admin fees payable under the EI Act;
- Column 2.15 A new Legislative column called "Administrative transactions against the Canada Pension Plan (CPP) Account" is now listed under the Legislative Program Financial Authorities Matrix. This new column will distinguish the authorities for charging administrative costs to the CPP Account from the authorities to issue CPP benefit payments;
- Column 2.15 Program positions have been delegated certification (Sec.34) authority for the Admin fees payable under the CPP ACT. Corporate certification (Sec.34) and Payment (Sec.33) authorities have also been delegated to the CFO, Senior DG, Directors and Functional Specialists ICAAD positions for the Admin fees payables under the CPP Act. These corporate authorities also include the weekly cash flow transfers to CPP Investment Board and the remittance of benefit withholds (Tax withholds, family order agreements, debt set-offs and deductions) payable to external parties;

- Footnotes were added to limit specific corporate authorities recently delegated.
